

The 2007 State Speed Stacking Championships



What is Speed Stacks?

Sport Stacking is an exciting individual and team sport where participants stack and unstack 12 specially designed plastic cups in pre-determined sequence.

The State Championships

The State Championships will be a competition between as many Schools as possible, making up teams (4 stackers each team, usually in the same age division), in 5 different events, played on a Sport Stacking Court.

- The Stack off will be the "best of 3 tries" in all of the 5 timed events. Also, just like in a tournament, the Head-to-Head Relay is the "best 2 out of 3 races."
- At least 1 Coach oversees and manages the whole team.
- A Sport Stacking Team Is made up of 4 or 5 stackers (The Coach will determine stacker rotation for each event).
- Each team will compete in one of the following suggested age divisions:
 - o 7 & Under
 - o 10 & Under
 - o 12 & Under
- Each team designates a Team Captain who has specific responsibilities during the match.
- Each team comes up with its own Team Name
- Stacker Responsibilities
 - o Understand the Stack Meet format and follow it properly
 - o Be in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing.
 - o Win humbly, lose graciously
 - o Lots of "high fives." .. Stack properly, doing the best you can. (Always fix your fumbles when they happen, and never give up!)

Points: How they are awarded

- Stackers earn points for their team based on their finishing place in each event
- Places are determined by best times in the 5 Timed Events and penalty points in the Head-to-Head Relay
- Point equivalents for each place are listed below based on each event. Note that in the case of a tie in any event, the points for that place are to be divided among those involved (i.e. If 2 stackers tie for 3rd place, each receive 1.5 points).
- All team points are added together to determine the total points for each school team
- The School team with the most points at the end, wins the Stack Off
- The child with the most individual score wins the Stack Off Champion for the day.

- Individual Events
 - o 1st Place = 5 points
 - o 2nd Place = 4 points
 - o 3rd Place = 3 points
 - o 4th Place = 2 points
 - o 5th Place = 1 points
- Relay Events
 - o 1st Place = 10 points
 - o 2nd Place = 5 points

Winners will receive certificates and Funtastic prize packs.

The individual stacker with the fastest time will be flown to VIC in March 2008 to compete in the National Championships against other state winners.

The overall winner of the National Championships will be sent with the Stackaroos to the World Championships in Denver, Colorado, USA.
